SDG Action & Awareness Week Overview

Purpose and Mission

The <u>University Global Coalition's</u> (UGC) Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Action & Awareness Week is an annual program, planned in partnership with the State University of New York (SUNY) and a committee that includes representatives from multiple universities globally. The purpose of this week is to increase awareness of the UN <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> among students, faculty, and staff in higher education and inspire them to take action in furtherance of the goals on their campuses and in their local community. We invite participants to plan and host a virtual, SDG-focused event for the UGC global calendar, attend an event, or plan events on their own campuses.

Events Overview

SDG Action & Awareness Week is held annually, typically during the first week of March. While the official program is one week/five days, partner universities often host events before and after SDG Week based upon their campus calendar.

In a call open to all universities, UGC invites partners across the global to plan free, virtual events focused upon their SDG-based areas of expertise, with an emphasis placed on



programs, courses, or other initiatives that are appealing to a broad, global audience and could lend to partnerships. Event organizers choose the date, time, and event format that works best for their calendars and share their event details with UGC through a web form. Event details are then shared on the <u>UGC event calendar</u> and through newsletters, social media, and with the help of promotional partners.

UGC also encourages campuses to plan and implement in-person events or programming on their campuses. The dual approach of virtual global events and in-person local events helps showcase a variety of ways to engage and learn. Most in-person events are not captured in this report.

In a particularly successful and inspiring example of utilizing the SDG Week concept regionally/locally, Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) Canada facilitated SDG Week Canada this year. Their calendar featured over 100 events hosted both virtually and in-person by Canadian Higher Education institutions. You can read more about SDG Week Canada on their website.

Demographics and Impact

Event organizers represented on the global virtual calendar represented eight countries from four continents:

- USA (North America)
- Canada
- Dubai (Asia)
- Spain (Europe)
- Turkey
- Mexico
- Colombia (South America)
- Scotland

Organizers were asked to report the number of participants in their events, where possible. Of those who provided participation figures (~27% of the organizers), a total of 856 participants were reported.

Organizers reported positive impact and opportunities, such as:

- "new international contacts" and a "team of panelists committed" to engaging further on the topic
- "Mayor visibilidad a acciones concretas en desarrollo sostenible/Greater visibility of concrete actions on sustainable development."
- 75% of organizers who responded to the survey either agreed or strongly agreed that participating in SDG Week increased both awareness of the SDGs on their campuses and actions towards the SDGs on their campus.

Organizers also shared challenges and opportunities for improvement, such as:

- Better "explaining [the] connection between SDG Awareness Week, SDG Week Canada, and [the] difference from SDG Action Week (in September)"
- Challenges coordinating international panelists and creating engaging and meaningful presentations
- Challenges with outreach (recruiting attendees) and promotion of the events

Next Steps

SDG Week partners will use the feedback from the organizer survey and the planning committee to plan for next year. Though the date is to be determined, SDG Week 2024 will occur in or around the first week of March. Some specific steps and feedback to be incorporated:



- Develop and promote resources and clear pathways for campuses, regions, or countries participating in localized SDG Weeks to better connect their efforts to UGC's SDG Week
- Support greater promotions of online events through UGC's partner organizations at the United Nations and elsewhere
- Directly connect SDG Action & Awareness Week 2024 to the UGC Annual Gathering (to be held in October 2023)
